

## Church Assessment Survey

**A Message from the GPS Task Force:** As we try to discern God's plan for our church, the GPS Task Force feels it is important for us to have a benchmark for where we are as a church now. This moment provides an important opportunity for us all to share together in assessing who we are as a church. To assist in this task we're using a survey that was developed by the Hartford Institute for Religion Research in Connecticut ([www.hartfordinstitute.org](http://www.hartfordinstitute.org)). They have helped hundreds of churches with surveys over the last 30 years. The survey not only asks several sets of questions about our congregation's current ministry and your own involvement, but also seeks your input on your vision for our future.

Completing this survey ensures that your views have been heard and it will give us a baseline from which to measure whether we are moving in directions that are aligned with God's plan for our church. We ask that each member of your household over the age of 14 complete the survey. You can do so by going to: <http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/uccgroton>

The survey began on Sunday, March 30. There will be a link to the online survey available in the Friday church-wide email as well as the weekly bulletin. There will also be a paper version available downstairs in Fellowship Hall. We'll have a table set up to provide information and answer any questions you may have. If you choose to complete the paper survey please return it to the church so that your responses can be entered into the computer. This survey will take approximately 30 minutes to complete.




