

### *A Message from FaST*

Your **Facilities Steering Team (FaST)** has accomplished a lot in the few weeks they've been at work. Our purpose is to oversee the different parts and pieces of our potential building project, tending to details while making sure we stay focused on our mission: *Sharing Christ~Changing Lives.*

We began with **visits to three churches** (of similar size to ours) that have been through building projects in recent years. There are a couple more churches we want to get to as well.

We **met with two realtors** to assess the Parish House and learn how it can best serve us should we decide to sell it.


We also **met with two architects** (and are planning to meet with at least one more) who are both enthusiastic about working with us. Eventually we will choose one with which to pursue master planning.

And lastly we **met with about 50 of you** after worship in January in three separate focus groups to "dream big" and to hear your thoughts about what is or is not important to you in a building project. The one thing that was consistent from all three groups was a sense that we are willing to let go of the Parish House in service of a single building on the church building land (and as an income source for funding the project).

**Next steps** for us are meeting with a third architect and obtaining costs for master planning from all three, visiting a couple more churches (including First Parish up the street), developing a schedule of visits with the different "departments" in the church to continue the conversations around what we will want in a new / renovated building.

If you were unable to attend the January conversation, please contact one of us with your thoughts (even better if you can put it in an email). We are keeping a real-time document with updates after each significant meeting we have. The link is in the weekly email, and we will have printed copies in the back of the Sanctuary.
