


A memorial service will be held on July 21, at 2:00 p.m. at the First Congregational Church in Concord NH.

## Stated Meeting (June 4) Summary

The congregation approved the Building Project in concept.

The congregation approved a Capital Campaign Feasibility Study.

The 2017 budget is where we expected with expenses and pledges. Committees have been spending conservatively so far this year. (If they want to spend more than 5% above their budget, they must get approval from Church Council.)

Endowments principal is \$435,550 as of May 26. Endowment disbursements have been used for an assortment of things over the years, including partially paying for the sanctuary piano, monitors for the classrooms and the lower sanctuary, Sunday School furniture, housing needs for members and defraying the cost of the Mother's Day brunch.

## Church Council (June 21) Summary

The Treasurer reported that pledges and expenses continue to be on track. Also, round banquet tables have been purchased from last year's Birthday Fund; the delay was due to lack of storage space.

There was a lengthy discussion on the direction that the 2018 budget should take; the discussion included representatives from Finance and also from Stewardship.

# Sunday School



Fall will be here before you know it, and we are busy at church preparing for Sunday School. We are adjusting the classes to keep the number of kids per class in balance and assigning rooms in the Parish House accordingly.

Sunday School Teachers will again teach in teams (3-4 teachers per team per grade). Each team will divide up the Sundays as fits their schedules, and coordinate directly with each other. This provides consistency for the kids and ready support for the teachers, while simplifying communication regarding the kids and the classes. We are still seeking a couple of teachers at each grade level. ## In their own words. . .



### Patrick Daly (Mentor: Halsey Platt)

*I have found that God lives with me more than I thought. Jesus and his teachings are an influence to do the right thing and to set me on the right path. He has guided me and given me a deeper understanding of how I should go through my daily life. His death shows to me that God loves me. The Bible is a reminder to me that God is with me wherever I go. It is comforting that He is always listening to what we have to say during prayer. I like to think of the little church "motto" as something that guides me in my faith journey - Sharing Christ, Changing Lives.*

### Taryn Emerle (Mentor: Bonnie Bionchi)

*Being a Christian has made a great difference in how I live, and how I view the world...and how I face issues, because I pray and rely on God to help me through difficult times. To me, Jesus is an example and a moral compass. I think that a member of this church does three things: believes, respects, and helps. 
### Kristina Hnath (Mentor: Mary Hanson)
