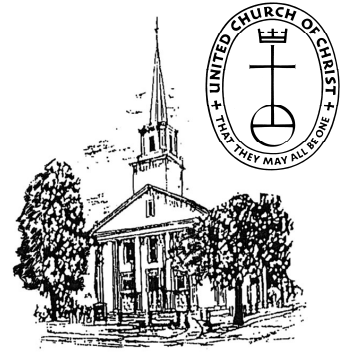

As I make my way through my final weeks with you, I am mindful of how important it is to live in the moment. I'm doing my best not to look too far ahead, lest I miss what's right in front of me! Though it does seem like the days are passing too quickly, and important things are right around the corner.

- June 9:** Confirmation - 14 youth are being confirmed! (The largest class in all my years here)
- June 16:** Final Worship and Goodbye Party
- June 22 (Sat.) - June 30 (Sun.):** Youth Mission Trip to West Virginia
- July 2-17:** Pack my office / organize files
- July 18:** Turn in my keys / drive away for the last time

After June 16, I will no longer be in worship on Sundays (Mission Trip and then we'll be traveling on the weekends - a rare opportunity for a pastor's family), but will be pleased to have lunch or coffee or a quick word with you in my office as respite from the packing! I have arranged for summer preachers (Gary, Susan Scott, Kaz Bem, Sarah Hubbell) through Labor Day. The July newsletter will have details about pastoral coverage throughout the summer.

Some of you have asked if I'll be coming back to visit here and what our relationships will look like after I leave. I won't be returning, except by invitation of the next pastor (Interim or Settled). It will be important for the new pastor to be your only pastor, and so it'd be inappropriate for me to remain in your lives. (I will read the monthly newsletter and hold you in my prayers. And you can check out the Trinitarian Congregational website to see what I'm up to there.) We will each figure out how to honor the ways in which our 13 years together have shaped who we are - you as a congregation, me as a pastor - while we begin new chapters taking us in different directions.

Here is a prayer that I've turned to through the years during times of disruption:

Lord God, You have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (Lutheran Book of Worship, 1978)

I am grateful for your kind words of expressed sadness and support for this new opportunity to serve in Concord. It is truly a bittersweet time for me (Mike and Sophia as well). I hold onto the promises of God - not that He will be with us, but that He IS with us!

For thirteen years I have signed these pastoral letters "With you on the journey," and since our journey together is not quite over....one last time....

A Message from Mike Smith

The past 13 years at UCC Groton has been nothing short of wonderful! So, it is with a very heavy heart that, along with Gail and Sophia, I say goodbye to this wonderful church family. Gail has always preached there is no “church” without the congregation, the extended church “family”; and all of you certainly have become our very close family. You all have meant so much to us as a family, and to each of us as individuals. As a congregation and as individuals you have been generous with your love, support, time and treasure. We have truly been blessed with such a wonderful “family.”

As for Sophia, being 15 years old this has been the only church she has known. We have lived in the same house for her whole life. She has been in the same school system with the same friends. So this is a new and difficult experience for her. I think she is coming to understand how much she has learned and been loved here. Your love and caring for her through her life will always be a cherished memory for Sophia and for us.

We will miss each and every one of you, and will never forget you. Leaving is going to be difficult; it already is. Once it became clear this change was coming, I have experienced each worship service, each interaction with all of you, differently. I have become aware that “this is the last time I will experience Maundy Thursday with this congregation; the last time I will experience music appreciation day; the last time I will do this, that or the other thing.” It has been difficult not to weep through each of these.

What will I miss about UCC Groton? More than I can articulate. Physically, all the lovely and quirky aspects of our building and grounds: the quintessential New England church structure, the slightly leaning steeple, the constantly evolving and improving interiors, the kitchen, the sanctuary without a center aisle, the lovely stained glass, the dimming lights when the organ is turned on. On the human side I will most miss the closeness of the small congregation, “where everybody knows your name,” to steal a line from the popular song from “Cheers!” Sometimes there is strength in small numbers.

CHURCH COUNCIL **May 29 Meeting Summary**

The Council voted to postpone the Stated Congregational Meeting that normally takes place in June. This meeting will now be held on either the 15th or 22nd of September and the congregation will be notified as soon as the date is set. At this time the Accessibility Steering Team also hopes to present to the congregation the architect’s design and cost estimates for the accessibility project.

Our Confirmation Class has met for the last time; there will be a rehearsal and celebration dinner on June 8 prior to Confirmation the next day. We have a group of 14 confirmands, so expect a full church that day!

The Missions committee has chosen *Hagar's Sisters* to be the recipient of our Harvest Fair profits this year. Hagar's Sisters vision is "Ending the cycle of domestic abuse through the transforming power of God".

The timing of Gail’s departure and final weeks was finalized. Her last service will be Sunday, June 16, followed by a celebration at Gibbet Hill. She will be away with the Youth Mission Trip from June 22-30, and then will be in the church office (although not preaching), packing up until July 18th. This will be her last day at the church.

The Deacons are completing our Church Profile so that the search for an Interim Pastor can begin in earnest.

Accessibility Project Update

The Accessibility Project Steering Team has been working closely with Paul Adison of Adison Architects to refine the plans to make both floors of our church fully accessible to all. The plans include a new entrance off Willowdale Road with a three-stop elevator that eliminates the need to construct a ramp to reach the Fellowship Hall. This approach will save on construction costs and also future maintenance costs associated with a ramp. Not needing a ramp also preserves the architectural character the church. The plans include new ADA compliant restrooms, two on each of the two main floors of the church, elements that we feel are essential to being truly accessible and hospitable to all. In addition to providing a welcoming entrance, the plans also include a coat closet, storage area for liturgical supplies, as well as a new music office/rehearsal room on the Sanctuary level. The proposed access way from the addition through to Fellowship Hall calls for relocating our current storage of tables and chairs to the current music office/storage room. Thus, the need to provide music related space elsewhere in the plan and at a better location on the Sanctuary level. The rear of the proposed addition at the first floor level includes a small covered porch facing Hollis Street that is in keeping with the character of neighboring homes and shops while also providing additional means of egress for safety.

The team will be reviewing the cost estimate and continuing to work with our architect in the coming weeks and into the Summer. Given the upcoming events in the life of our church, including Pastor Gail's departure, we have postponed our presentation of the project to the congregation to September. We want to do this project WELL, not rushed. Continue to ask us questions and also please continue to keep the project in your prayers.

We look forward to learning more about Hagar's Sisters' ministry in late Summer/early Fall and working with its staff in deciding how to highlight this important ministry at the Fair.

On April 27, volunteers from UCC Groton served at the Hagar's Sisters Comedy Benefit in Burlington, MA. Four volunteers purchased flowers and helped with the morning set-up for the event, preparing the tables and decorating the hall. Three additional people helped during the event itself, working the silent auction tables. The benefit featured live comedy, silent and live auctions, live music, door prizes and an amazing assortment of desserts. The comedy event raised \$50,000 to benefit Hagar's Sisters in the upcoming year.
