It hardly seems possible that a month of our Sabbatical journey has come and gone. In my ever-so-brief time here, I have been moved by the depth of your faith, your dedication and devotion to this church, and your passion to keep exploring and growing in your relationship with Christ. The vibrancy I feel here at UCC is palpable at committee meetings, Bible studies, book groups, worship services, coffee hours, and during individual conversations. I already feel blessed by the richness I am finding here in this beloved community.

As our Sabbath journey continues, some of you are already creating Sabbath time in your lives by participating in book groups, Bible studies, or by getting together with someone to pray. In January, I invited you to share your thoughts and ideas for how each of us, and our church community, can create some Sabbath time—holy time—in the midst of our busy lives. Below are the ideas you have shared so far:

- Take time to sit alone, light a candle, and contemplate Jesus, the light of world.
- Turn off the computer devices in your life.
- Participate in reading *Giving to God.*
- Have at least one church potluck supper, maybe at a halfway point during the Sabbatical.
- Eat healthier; get adequate exercise and rest.
- Listen and relax to these hymns, *Relaxation Hymns 1*, *Relaxation Hymns 2*, or *Relaxation Hymns 3*. They can be found on YouTube.
- Honor and recognize the work of volunteers in the church with a luncheon. Perhaps list volunteers and committee members in the bulletin.
- Interview senior members about their church experiences. Share their stories in the Union Courier and archive them.
- Ask people to submit a prayer or poem that has been meaningful and publish.
- In your quiet time, think about what it means to be holy (find some scriptures about this), call upon (pray to) the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is our advocate while Christ Jesus prepares a place for his church.
- Go to your bedroom, close the door, kneel by your bedside, and pray in silence.

Truly, all of these Sabbath ideas are worth pursuing. I invite you to take a Sabbath break and try out some of these ideas. Take time to sit and contemplate Jesus. Turn off your computer devices and play a game with your spouse or kids. Join the book group, reading *Giving to God*, and discover how Giving to God is a deep expression of your faith. Listen to some relaxing hymns to sooth your mind, body, and spirit. Get the whole church community together to share our faith and a potluck feast.

CHURCH COUNCIL Meeting Summary January 8

Treasurer Kelli Hnath reviewed the final budget from 2013. Income was slightly above expenses, resulting in a favorable net difference of 5%. Lorrie Morgan distributed Endowment Allocations of 1.5%. This is money to be used outside of the budgeted operating expenses. Liz Smith presented the revised 2014 budget. After discussion, it was unanimously recommended to be presented to the congregation. Martha Dean reported that the following funds from Christmas Angels were distributed: \$545 for the Youth Mission Trip, \$390 for CFCA, \$415 for Heifer International, and \$395 for Loaves & Fishes. The Christmas Eve collection for Veterans of the Cross was \$2,838. A motion to recommend the nominations and appointments of the Nomination Task Force was approved unanimously.


Join hundreds of pastors and lay leaders from across two Conferences for a day of "Risking Vision" through worship, workshops, forums, networking and a marketplace.

GPS Task Force

Update on the GPS Task Force

For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building. By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as a wise builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. ~ 1 Cor. 3:9-11

We came together as a group for the first time on August 27, 2013. Our purpose is to define the path forward for our church. We have met a total of eight times since then.

We've spent time examining different types of churches and discussed what type of church we are. We learned about the common life cycle of a church and its ongoing need for renewal. We also talked about where each of us felt our church was in the cycle. It's interesting to hear different opinions on these subjects. We've seen that how a person sees the church has a lot to do with their own personal background, as well as the length of time they've been with our church.

We've spent much time in prayer and thought about these questions: 'Why is UCC Groton here?' and 'What is God calling us to do?' We believe that God will lead us to the answers we need. Another step we feel is important is to talk to each of you and hear what you think is important about this church. We're in the process of figuring out how to do that so look for more information on that in the future. In the meantime, feel free to seek out any of us and let us know what you think about your church.

We're currently reading *What's Theology got to do with it?*, by Anthony B. Robinson. So far our discussions have centered on things like what makes a vital and healthy congregation and the role the Bible and scripture have in that. How do you keep energy going in the church? What is our identity? We are finding this book thought provoking and we may share parts of it with you in the future. If you are looking for a book to help you think about our church in a new way, we recommend this one.

We feel that, before we can move forward, we need to determine where we are now. We have spent much of our time on that vital question. We ask that you continue to keep our work in your prayers. There is no tool more powerful for us than that.
