## July-September Meeting Summaries

The church finances (income and expenses) remain on budget.
The Fellowship Hall ceiling and the new piano were the big expenditures over the summer; these costs have been covered without borrowing and without dipping into the Endowment principal.

The budgeting process has begun based upon conservative increased pledging. On November 23 there will be an all-church meeting to discuss the budget for 2015. Still in question is the funding of capital projects.

The Missions Committee is in need of more members.
The GPS (God's Purpose Seekers) will hold an All-Church Meeting on October 29 to discuss the results of the survey taken in the spring and where they are in answering the question 'What is God asking us to do as a Church?'

## Stated Meeting Summary (September 14)

The Endowment Committee reported that endowments are up $10 \%$ (up $\$ 391 \mathrm{~K}$ from $\$ 351 \mathrm{~K}$ ) and that this trend is expected to continue through the $3^{\text {rd }}$ quarter of next year.

The PPRC By-Law change was passed unanimously; the Mission and Purpose By-Law change (trinity language) was passed after much discussion.

Jean Armstrong was nominated and approved to be a member of the Christian Education committee.
