Your "front page" this month comes from David Lose. David used to be a preaching professor where I went to seminary, and is now the President of The Lutheran Theological Seminary of Philadelphia. If I could have written this, I would have! I share his thinking 100%.

Margaret Atwood's poem *The Moment* expresses a beautiful understanding of stewardship as far more than having to do with our finances. Here is David's reflection:

A sense of ownership, of deserving, of having earned the good we enjoy in this life is, I believe, the mortal enemy of gratitude. For gratitude recognizes our empty hands and can only give thanks for what has filled them. Gratitude looks around in wonder at all that furnishes our life and feels no sense of accomplishment, only a surprised delight in good fortune. When we feel grateful it is hard to be mean or cruel or indifferent, for we perceive that all of life is a gift, and gifts make us feel special and capable and both responsible and responsive. How can we not give back when we realize how much has been given to us?

But the moment we've decided that we are not stewards but owners, not recipients but creators, not blessed but entitled, all the wonder and magic of the world vanishes, leaving us alone with

our self-satisfied hearts, grateful to no one but ourselves, connected by no obligation of love or duty, triumphant in our loneliness.

May we never tarry in such moments for long. Not on Thanksgiving. Not at Christmas. Not even on our birthday or the day of our promotion or retirement. No, not ever.

God has blessed us, sought us out, and found us. And acknowledging that in grateful surprise is surely the beginning of both wisdom and happiness. Which, when you think about it, means that perhaps the most important words to say across the journey of our lives is not, finally, "I love you," but the shorter, sweeter phrase, "Thank you."

Thank you, David Lose, for your good words.

And thank you God for everything!

The moment when, after many years of hard work and a long voyage you stand in the centre of your room, house, half-acre, square mile, island, country, knowing at last how you got there, and say, I own this,

is the same moment when the trees unloose their soft arms from around you, the birds take back their language, the cliffs fissure and collapse, the air moves back from you like a wave and you can't breathe.

No, they whisper. You own nothing. You were a visitor, time after time climbing the hill, planting the flag, proclaiming. We never belonged to you. You never found us. It was always the other way round.

## Stewardship & Finance

The FY2015 proposed budget will be ready for review on November 9<sup>th</sup> and the all-church meeting to approve the budget will be on November 23<sup>rd</sup>. Please take the time to read through the proposed budget and let us know your questions. Any of us can answer them or refer you to someone who can. There are a few proposed changes from 2014 that we would like to highlight:

- 1. We recommend hiring a clerk to assist with accounts payable, bookkeeping, check preparation and other similar duties. The cost for this is \$3,000.
- 2. We are anticipating income of \$1,000 from sale of the piano.
- 3. We have an accrual for future pastor sabbatical of \$2,500.
- 4. We have added a new line for Stephen Ministry (under Diaconate) to cover materials for the new Stephen Ministry program.
- 5. The U.C.C. Massachusetts Conference has modified their request for contributions from member churches as follows. No annual dues per member will be charged, this amount has been combined with Our Church's Wider Mission and together they are a contribution that will help the U.C.C. fund mission-related work. We are calling this new line U.C.C. Contribution and the amount for 2015 is \$9,240. (Compared to \$8,000 combined in 2014.)
- 6. Our 2015 Budget funds operating expenses, but not capital requests.

#### **Treasurer Position**

In addition to the changes above, we are looking for a volunteer to serve as Treasurer starting a three-year term in January. After five years of dedicated service, Kelli Hnath is "retiring" at the end of this year. They are big shoes to fill, but we just know that there is someone in our congregation with the skills, aptitude, and desire to serve in this way. The duties of the Treasurer include the following and take about 8-10 hours per month (somewhat more at budget time in the fall and Annual Report time in December/January).

- Accountability for all church finances
- Ensure complete record-keeping of receipts and expenditures
- Provide an itemized report of funds at the Annual Church Meeting
- Support the preparation of the annual budget
- Present current financial reports to the Church Council, and church ministries and committees at Council meetings
- Present all financial reports to the Church Council upon request or to legal successor at expiration of term
- Member of Stewardship and Finance Committee
- Member of Church Council
- Serve as one of the Church Officers

The following qualifications are important for the Treasurer:

- Strong analytical ability and attention to detail
- Ability to communicate clearly and effectively
- Comfortable presenting to small and large groups
- Proficiency in Excel and Quickbooks required
- Background in finance or accounting

## Stewardship: Finding the Joy

Well, we believe that it can be and should be. This is what every committee, task force, and individual in our church is to be working toward: growing closer to God, and inspiring others into closer relationships with God as well.

Pray, again. Think about the fact that in the letter is a radical, beautiful, grace and joy-filled way of thinking about stewardship. Re-read the letter. Pray about what dreams you have for the church, listen to hear what dreams God has for our church. Realize that the seeds to fulfill that dream are in our midst; they are right here. We simply need to receive the gifts of God's grace and blessings and respond with joy in our giving back to God. What a great idea!

## This homeless ministry in Boston is in particular need of winter coats, backpacks and socks (new white).

#### **ITEMS NEEDED**

- Backpacks, tote bags, fanny packs, small suitcases with wheels (used and in good condition)
- Travel-size toiletries such as soap, shampoo, deodorant, lotion, Chapstick, toothpaste, and shaving cream in small sizes, as well as tooth brushes and disposable razors, and tampons in small quantities (please no aftershave or mouthwash containing alcohol)

## **GPS—God's Purpose Seekers**

For the past year, we have spent time reading, praying, listening, discussing and discerning.

#### Reading

Since we began, we have been reading *What's Theology Got To Do With It?*, by Tony Robinson, discussing about a chapter a month, and are nearly finished with it. We also read articles we found along the way, some written by Christians for the church, some by experts in the fields of organizational management and leadership.

#### **Prayer**

We spend a lot of time in prayer — sometimes we pray through the church directory for each person by name; sometimes we pray the Scriptures and let the Holy Spirit direct our thoughts; sometimes we visualize the Sanctuary on a Sunday morning and pray for the people who come to our minds eye; sometimes we pray silently.

#### Listening

The first half of 2014 was spent on the Congregational Inventory: preparing it, administrating it, and then gathering the results into a shareable document (handed out at the GPS Open House Wed., Oct. 29, and available in the church office). We have also met with the Church Council twice and held an Open House on October 29.

#### **Discussing**

We have talked about our history and our hopes for the future. We have talked about where we as a congregation are most alive and where we are getting tired. We talk about our life together and what Christ wants for his church in general, and specifically for us. We talk about leadership and change, about caring for the congregation we are and serving those God brings our way. We talk about the joys and the cost of discipleship.

#### **Discerning**

Put all this together and we are discerning what God wants for us as the Body of Christ. We listen for the Holy Spirit to speak through each person at our meetings, and through everyone we talk with at church.

We are grateful for the 20 people who attended the Open House. The conversation was spiritual, thoughtful, and uplifting. Please continue to pray for us as we are humbly serving as God's Purpose Seekers; and find any of us at any time to learn more, share your thoughts, ask your questions.




## Serving on Committees and Ministries
