## **Questions! Questions!**

Sometimes I think the questions we ask are as important as the answers we give. This is certainly the case during a Confirmation year, when we explore the Christian faith with our young teens. Each week at the end of class, we give the kids 3x5 notecards to write down any question they have about the faith or the church or the topic we just discussed. Some questions come around week after week, with a different spin or angle; others are unique and very specific. All the questions are thoughtful and meaningful.

Then at the beginning of the next class session, we take the first 15-30 minutes answering them. Pete Hnath (who teaches with me) and I volley the questions back and forth, often simply turning the question back to the kids. I love this part of our time together, and I am always eager at the end of the night to read the next set of questions.

I thought it might be nice to share some of these questions and bring some of the spirit of Confirmation class to worship. So on January  $4^{th}$ , rather than a traditional sermon, Pete and I will answer some of the Confirmation questions that we think are also your questions. We'll also invite you to reflect on a "faith resolution" as we enter the new calendar year together.

\*\*\*\*\*\*

Pablo Casals (1876-1973) was one of the greatest cello players of all time. He maintained a performing / composing / conducting career late into his old age. At the age of 93 he was asked why he continued to practice the cello three hours a day. He replied, "I'm beginning to notice some improvement."

The Christian community is a community which can never stop learning if it wishes to remain Christian. Jesus did not come among us to teach a set of unchanging, absolute religious propositions. If that had been his purpose, then Christianity would be a relatively simple matter of learning doctrines – like memorizing multiplication tables or Latin noun declensions. There's a bit of work involved, but it is possible to master the material.

But one can never master the material involved in these words of Jesus: *Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it* (Matt. 10:39). We can only hear and struggle with them. And get together with others who also struggle with them! And so, we are offering an opportunity to do just that. 

### **Church Council Meeting Summary** December 17

The 2014 budget is coming in at \$2K budgeted net.

The 2015 budget is being adjusted; 90 pledges have come in which constitute 89% of the estimated pledge income for our 2015 Operating Budget. The budget will be voted on at the February 1 Annual Meeting and will be available at the back of the Sanctuary or in the Church Office January 18.

There was a discussion on conducting all-church meetings without Robert's Rules. It appears that most do not like Robert's Rules, some votes are necessary and there must be a clear decision-making procedure. The Townsend Congregational Church does not use Robert's Rules; they will be meeting with us in January; watch the announcements for further details. Please contact Rev. Gail or Stefanie Lempp with comments.

#### A Season of Discernment

At the Congregational meeting in November, we began experimenting with conducting church business in a way that is:

- more Christ centered,
- which invites every voice in the room to be heard,
- and seeks agreement rather than winners and losers.

Knowing that this is a process to be developed over time, we are eager to hear your thoughts in a couple of forums.

At the gathering on the 21st we have also invited the Moderator and a couple others from the UCC Church in Townsend, which has shifted away from meetings governed by Robert's Rules to a Discernment Model. They will share with us why and how they made this change, as well as what it actually looks like in the life of their church. And of course they will answer any questions we may have. This will be a valuable opportunity. Please plan to attend one or both events so that we may hear from you and so we can learn together, while we discern what God wants for our church.

### GPS (God's Purpose Seekers) Update

Pete Hnath is one of the eight serving on this task force, which has been charged with (among other things) answering these questions: Who are we? And what is God calling us to do? Pete reflects on where we're at as we turn the page into 2015.

Those who know me would agree that patience is not a strength of mine. I like to "see a problem, fix a problem." Learning to operate on God's time has been an unanticipated (and sometimes challenging) blessing of my time with the God's Purpose Seekers (GPS) Task Force. It's now evident to me that the Spirit has been persistently and patiently working through each of us to discern a common understanding of what God is calling Union Congregational Church to be.

Over the past two months the GPS has completed our review of the exceptional book "What's Theology Got to Do With It?", the final three chapters of which focused our attention on the sacraments, the "end times" and the Pastor's role as teacher. We also spent time reviewing the church's 20 year worship attendance history and discussing the principles of facilitating change.

As the Spirit has built consensus within our eight-person team, it's allowed us to begin to transition from reflection to documentation of what we believe God is saying to us. We have a team retreat planned for early January during which we'll be working to synthesize God's vision and to outline recommendations. Our goal is to have a substantive update to share with the congregation by early Spring. We ask for your continued prayer and welcome your input and your questions.

### Stewardship 2015: Be Inspired—Share the Joy

The Stewardship Team thanks all those who pledged for 2015.

As of December 21st, we have received 91% of our goal with 93 pledges in hand.

New this year was asking you to find your *joyful number*, and by doing so we hope that you will draw closer to God "who loves a cheerful giver" (I Cor 7:9). We have also been on a journey to become more comfortable talking about money in general and our giving to the church. We've read books together, enjoyed small group discussion gatherings, invited prayerful support of our work, and had many individual conversations with you throughout the past year.

And so, in that vein, we want to share with you reflections from some of the CHEERFUL GIVERS in our church:

- My joyful number stayed the same for 2015 because I retired in 2014. Originally, I considered lowering my pledge but that did not feel right. Giving to God and the church is extremely important to me and does provide great joy. I do have faith that God will provide and will give me the wisdom to manage the budget so that I can fulfill this joyous commitment.
- Our joyful number for 2015 was a decrease because we have increased our pledge to our old church that is having financial difficulty.
- Our joyful number stayed the same for 2015 because we are anticipating a possible decrease in our income. Keeping the number the same will therefore be an "increase" in our giving from the perspective of our household. We feel good knowing that we are NOT decreasing our giving to the church, though our income may go down. We also know that we can increase our pledge mid-year if our income doesn't decrease.
- My joyful pledge decreased because I realized I was not giving joyfully to the church. Two years ago I increased my pledge beyond what was truly sustainable. To fulfill this pledge I stopped giving to organizations that were important to me. I try to balance my giving, which runs between 15 and 20% of my limited income, between the church, social justice, and conservation organizations. Saying "No" to these other groups was painful. I appreciate the growth in spirit and member led activities at Union Congregational and want to support that. To accomplish all this I have decreased my pledge to the church in order to give to others.
- My joyful number for 2015 increased because it's a joy and a privilege to be able to do so. I believe everything I have comes from God. It's important to me to give back.
- Our joyful number for 2015 is an increase from last year because we continue to be blessed by God's abundant gifts in our lives: family and friends, church community and faith building, and good health, to name just a few! We have so much more than what could be considered "daily needs" and giving to the church is one way to celebrate this lov.
- Our joyful number for 2015 increased because we feel blessed and wanted to share that good feeling with the church.




