## A Message from the Pastor Parish Relations Committee

We are writing to tell you about an exciting new process that we have decided to use within our congregation to help provide high-quality feedback to our minister, staff, and lay leaders about how we all are experiencing the life and mission of our church. We have been guided in building this process with the help of the book *Completing the Circle: Reviewing Ministries in the Congregation* by David McMahill and by training sessions with leaders from the South Acton Congregational Church. Our Church Council has been informed about the new process and has given the PPRC it's blessing to move forward on it.

In years past our church has utilized different methods of performance evaluations of our minister ranging from questionnaire forms to small group discussions. While these were supposed to be 'annual' evaluations, with the hustle and bustle of life, there were times when we didn't get it done; and in recent years when we were consistently engaged in an annual review process, the sampling of feedback was limited. For many reasons, we have not been confident in the process nor the information provided by these methods.

This year we have decided to start using a simple but quite different process called "Feedback/Reflection Circles." The goal of this process is to help our church answer the questions 'how are we doing in serving our congregation and in achieving our church's mission?' Periodically, throughout our church year, small groups from within our congregation will be invited to meet with a trained facilitator and a scribe (from within our church) in feedback/reflection circles. These group discussions will provide an opportunity for participants to share how they are experiencing various aspects of our church's life and mission. This important aspect of the feedback/reflection groups will be explained in more detail at the beginning of each group.

Each feedback/reflection group will have a specific focus. Over time there will be groups that discuss the experience of being a member of one of our boards, committees, or ministries. Other groups will focus on other aspects of our life, such as missions, Christian education, or the experience of becoming a new member. In a few groups over the course of the year the discussion will be centered on what participants experience in worship. Pastor Gail will be present at all of these groups, but will not actively participate in the discussions. The scribe will take notes that will remain anonymous and will be appropriately distributed to the body (or bodies) within the church that can apply the information discussed toward serving our congregation and fulfilling our church's mission.

In a few more weeks, more information will be shared about when and how you will be asked to participate in a feedback/reflection group. We can tell you now that, for the groups that will focus on the experience of worship, we will be circulating sign-up lists and you will be asked to sign up for just one group during the year in order to allow for a wider reach in participation in these small group settings.

It is important for us to emphasize that we are not initiating this new method in response to a problem in our congregation. We want to put into place an easy system for obtaining high-quality feedback, and we want that system to rely on healthy habits of interpersonal communications. We believe that good feedback is to our community life what breathing and eating are to our biological lives. Without it, we simply do not function very well as a community.

We invite you to call on any member of the PPRC with any questions you have about this new program.

#### Annual Stated Meeting (June 14) Summary

**Treasurer's Report:** Our finances are doing well. While in the past we have been in survival mode, we are now thriving.

**Endowment Report:** The Endowment as of June 11<sup>th</sup> is \$394K. Over the last 2.5 years it has grown at 7%; growth is expected to be over 5%.

**GPS Report:** The GPS church survey showed that the congregation would like more opportunities in the areas of adult education and service; each committee has been asked to plan an event in one of these areas — watch for updates!

Capital Needs Report: Jonathan New, the UCC's Associate Conference Minister of Stewardship and Finance met with members from Finance, Endowment, GPS and Buildings and Grounds as a first step toward a capital campaign. Several years ago the Conference advised against a capital campaign, but now we are excellently poised to consider one. The budget for next year (2016) will include \$3-4K for a capital campaign consultant to do a comprehensive feasibility study.

Harvest Fair Profit Conversation: There was a discussion regarding where proceeds from the Harvest Fair would go this year. There has been a generous \$7K gift given to cover the Fundraising line item (which is needed to balance our budget). This frees up the proceeds of the Fair for another purpose. Originally, the donors asked that the proceeds be directed in Mission; they have since decided to allow the Church Council to determine where the proceeds should go. We have been moving away from dependence on the Harvest Fair to balance our budget; the decision by Church Council about where proceeds of the Fair will go will be for this year only; further discussion will be needed regarding Fair proceeds in future years, assuming we are in the same position. The consensus of the room was that the Fair profit be given entirely to a special mission project, and that the Council should make a final decision about this at its next meeting (see p. 4)

#### Church Council (June 17) Meeting Summary

At the May Church Council meeting, a generous donation of \$7K was accepted on behalf of the church. The intent of the gift was to relieve the church from having to make \$7K in profit at the Harvest Fair in order to balance the budget; the donors hoped the proceeds of the Fair would be put toward a Mission project. Since the May meeting, the donors changed the nature of the gift slightly, still giving \$7K to offset the fundraising line item in the budget, but asking Church Council to make the decision about how the Fair proceeds should be used. After hearing discussion on this issue at the June 14 Stated Meeting, the Church Council decided to allocate all proceeds from the 2015 Fair to a specific mission project, to be determined by the Missions Committee — preferably a local ministry, so that the ministry can be integrated into the Fair in ways that give our church and the community an opportunity to connect and form relationships.

On August 30, there will be a Feedback Circle to discuss summer worship. (See article p. 1) There will be another Feedback Circle in November to discuss the Harvest Fair.

Christian Education sent out a survey in the June 19<sup>th</sup> email on the subject of adult educational opportunities. If you missed it, or do not have email, please ask Carol for a copy of the survey.

The Church is in the process of performing annual reviews for the church's four employees (Bernard Crane, Tom Hanson, Bita Reilley, and Carol Zaiatz).

# Massachusetts Conference, United Church of Christ Annual Meeting June 12 - 13, 2015

On Saturday, June 13, Reverend Marvin Caldwell and Erica Davenport represented our church at the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ. It was held this year at UMass, Amherst. The theme of the conference was based on 2 Corinthians 4:7 — "But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us."

The plenary sessions on Saturday covered budget actions, clergy compensation guidelines, and actions on the following resolutions: Dismantling discriminatory systems of mass incarceration in Massachusetts, a proposal to not renew the lease on the Craigville properties, and a call for the UCC to take actions toward a just peace in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. All actions passed, but not unanimously.

In the afternoon, Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber, founding pastor of House for All Saints and Sinners in Denver, CO, was the key-note speaker. Her dynamic message brought to us the key elements of her highly successful counter-cultural ministries. She emphasized that being "welcoming" is not the same as being "friendly." A congregation or church setting can be friendly and still not be welcoming of people and their needs.

# Harvest Fair: Sharing Christ-Changing Lives



Since the Harvest Fair is now freed from the burden of meeting a target income to support our Operating Budget (see p. 3 & 4), the Missions Committee has prayerfully considered how the Holy Spirit is leading us to put these funds to work in His name. Among the criteria we considered in selecting a compelling mission were: Christian-focused, local, relational, existing partnership and potential for impact. Based on those criteria, the Committee has selected *Common Cathedral*, known to us as *City Reach*, as the organization we will partner with this year. Here is a brief overview of the ministry:

**Common Cathedral** is an outdoor congregation, for the housed and un-housed, sharing God's love through community, pastoral care, creative expression, and worship on Boston Common. They are non-proselytizing and ecumenical. They welcome and support all people. Common Cathedral's goals:

- To remind chronically un-housed adults in downtown Boston of who they are children of God, loved by God, worthy in the eyes of God
- To form supportive spiritual community with chronically un-housed adults in downtown Boston, with those moving off the streets into housing, and between housed and un-housed people
- To advocate for and with un-housed people toward ending the condition of homelessness in Boston and the Commonwealth.

Partnering with Common Cathedral will offer us a number of opportunities to work together:

- Actively promote Common Cathedral as the beneficiary of the Fair
- Common Cathedral Pastor Mary Eaton and staff members (Leigh, Brenda and others) will join us for the day of the Fair
- We will have signage throughout the fair about Ecclesia Ministries and Common Cathedral perhaps even a scheduled talk up in our sanctuary.
- **Common Art** sale as part of the Fair. Common Art is a Common Cathedral program where the un-housed have an opportunity to express their artistic gifts.
- The Staff will help lead us in worship on Sunday providing us an opportunity to further learn about homelessness in Boston
- In **November**, our church will participate in the overnight City Reach program, which distributes clothes and food to those in need in Boston. The net proceeds of the Fair will be used to support this ministry

We are still working with the City Reach staff to determine the best use of the Fair funds. Stay tuned! To learn more about Common Cathedral's people and programs, visit their web page: commoncathedral.org.


