Many years ago (like nearly 20!) I heard a clever phrase from a colleague that has stayed with me: *Worship Plus Two*. We would invite everyone in the church to participate in *Worship Plus Two* — to worship (of course) and then to find two other things to do at church — one which feeds YOU and one which feeds OTHERS. So you might attend a class or prayer service (feeding yourself) and then you might work at the Fair or take a meal to someone in need (feeding others — literally!).

The 2015 version of this might be called *www.church.love*! The three w's being: Worship Word Witness

Worship: It is vital for us to bring our whole selves (our joys and our struggles, our sufferings and our celebrations) to God; and then be lifted up to see, hear, taste and receive assurances of God's presence in Christ with us.


Word: It is my deep desire that all who call this church home will have an **active, growing** relationship with Christ. Emphasis on **active and growing**! And the primary way we do this is by engaging the Word (Christ) through the word (Bible). But simply hearing a few passages read and preached on Sundays is not enough. Because what happens on Sunday morning is essentially a "monologue" — I talk, you listen. Growth comes through dialogue, not monologue. And to do this we must meet together around a text or a topic (doesn't have to be only the Bible) and, as Linda Richman (Mike Myers' character on SNL in the 90's) used to say, "Discuss..." We'll be offering a Parenting Class in October/November called *Sticky Faith* that will be a great opportunity for this.

Witness: We are called to serve — to share what we have, what we know, what we love — with others. And there are many opportunities for this at church this fall....these pages are full of ways we can share the abundance of love and joy we have experienced and known in our lives.

So, before your calendars become too full, flip through this newsletter, or take home the green announcements page from Sunday and fill your fall with *www.church.love*!

Church News

Church Council July Meeting Summary

At the July 13 Church Council meeting, Pete Hnath reported that the Missions committee has decided that the profit from this year's Harvest Fair will go to Common Cathedral (City Reach, our annual overnight trip to Boston, is part of this organization). Several people from the organization will be at the Fair, including the associate minister and several of the staff who are homeless; some will stay overnight and be in church on Sunday to give testimonials. They have a distinctive cross that they give out to the homeless and we will buy these for them; they would like to start a new ministry around the holidays and we can partner with them on this.

There was a discussion on our decision-making process and specifically the Birthday Fund. Some of the questions were: who should decide? should we solicit ideas from the congregation? from committees? should we spend it every year? how much communication should there be? The consensus appeared to be that the process regarding how to spend the Birthday Fund should be simple, possibly using a process that's already in place. As far as other decisions, we were reminded that we, the Church Council, are the deciding body for the congregation between church meetings.




