The Joy of a Generous Heart Sharing Christ - Changing Lives

Hopefully, filling our generosity boxes has increased your awareness of all the wonderful acts of kindness, sharing, giving, and generosity that we experience every day. The generosity box activity may be over but we can continue to appreciate the joyful and generous lives God has provided for us. As faithful stewards, we are grateful for everything that God has bestowed upon us and are excited to give back to Him.

The Ministry Plan for 2016, available in the pews and on our website, highlights many of the ministries our church has been able to provide through our past giving. We are blessed to have so many opportunities to experience God's grace and love and grow closer to God. Why stop here? Isn't it exciting to think about what our church could do if we had more money? The Ministry Plan also describes future ministries our church would like to establish and support. It is through more music, more Christian education classes, increased support to local and global charities, etc., that our church can move people along their faith journey.

The preliminary budget for 2016 (which will be available at church on November 8) details a need for an additional \$75,000 in income. In the life of the church there are ebbs and flows in the congregation and for a number of years we have had little attrition. However, in the last two years we have had a number of families relocate, as well as a few one-time "above and beyond" gifts. The combined total of these move-aways and one-time gifts is \$32,000. We have also asked committees to develop budgets for 2016 which include Christ centered growth. The committees have asked for a combined increase of \$43,000. (Again, check out the 2016 Ministry Plan in the Sanctuary to learn more about this.) Collectively, we believe that we have the resources to do this!

Please be on the lookout for the annual stewardship letter. Over the past six months the Stewardship Team has attended a conference, had many discussions, and prayed for guidance in preparation of this year's stewardship message. We ask that you find a quiet time to sit and thoughtfully read the letter. Please take time to remember all the blessings God has provided. Do you feel the generosity in your heart and can you find joy in giving back to Him?

Pledge Sunday is November 15. More money equals more ministry. And it is through more ministry that we move closer to Christ, share Christ with more people, and change more lives.

October 28 Meeting The nursery is seeking a new attendant; please send resumes. 
ITEMS NEEDED
