# An Advent Message from Your Pastor

The Apostle Paul wrote a letter to the church in Thessalonica. In it he said:

How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you? Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you face to face and restore whatever is lacking in your faith. Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus direct our way to you. And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

(1 Thessalonians 3:9-13)

We live in the pull between the past and the future. We live in the now and the not yet. The coming of Advent and the beginning of a new church calendar year provides us an opportunity to reflect on how we live with purpose. Like the Thessalonians, we wait for the promise of Jesus' return, and yet we grow weary of waiting. Paul understands this tension and reminds this fledgling church, and us today, that we don't wait alone and that while

we wait there is God's work to be done! Paul prays that love will increase among the people, for God is most fully revealed to the world by love. This love that looks forward, moves us forward, transforms our present reality. Building each other up in love, praying night and day, looking for God's work in the world while we wait, pulls us into the hope of God's promises for newness, forgiveness and mercy through Jesus. We wait for the proclamation of the Good News that God became human — a stunning thing to contemplate to be sure! And God sent messengers ahead to prepare the people there for his coming. This year we'll look at those messengers and their messages to prepare our hearts, homes, and lives for a renewed relationship with our Lord.

We discussed the process for the Potential Building Project and spent time brainstorming what is important to us in new or renovated buildings. We will continue this conversation in an all church forum on Ian. 24. 2016. In the meantime, a Steering Committee will be formed to oversee the process.

The Annual Meeting will be on February 7. Agenda: finalize the 2016 budget, important committee updates and the new roster of committees.

## **Special Congregational Meeting Summary** Sunday, November 22

The preliminary 2016 budget was proposed and accepted. (Available on the tables in the Sanctuary).

CONGREGATIONAL The current 2015 budget is on track to finish with expenses favorable to income. Some items in the 2016 budget might be covered by the overage or through Endowment disbursements.

The Harvest Fair is currently a pass-through item, and we've scheduled a conversation on Dec. 16 (see above) to discuss this in more detail.

Conversations have begun at the Church Council about a potential building project. The GPS (God's Purpose Seekers) Task Force is recommending a process for this (see the handout on the back tables in the Sanctuary).



Do you ever wonder what God is really doing? Do you wonder how can God be doing anything in the midst of the chaos of the world? Have you ever wondered what part you, as an individual, play in all of this? Well if you have and you are still searching for answers this is the group for you.

Beginning on January 10 we begin a six session small group journey called the Kingdom Agenda: Living Life God's Way. The message of the Kingdom is

sorely lacking today. This is not because people don't speak of the Kingdom, but because too often we speak in esoteric, theological code words that seem unrelated to the realities of life in the here and now.

The Christian message, when communicated from a comprehensive Kingdom perspective, provides an agenda that can stand next to and above all other attempts to define the meaning of life, whether for the individual, the family, the church, or the nation. A Kingdom Agenda is based on God's Word — rather than a secular agenda based on human ideas — is the best way to make all of life work as our Creator intended. 
