As we round the corner into a new year, I'm mindful that this is also a new DECADE for us at church. Last summer, I began my 10th year as your Pastor! (June 1, 2016 will be our 10th "Anniversary" together.) At milestones like this though, I tend to look forward rather than backwards. And especially with the GPS (God's Purpose Seekers) Task Force winding down and morphing into the next phase of our life together, I am feeling an eagerness for "what's next."

The GPS has had us "try on" the prime directive of *Sharing Christ* — *Changing Lives*. Everything we do here at church should tie back to that purpose. Next, we asked "How do we share Christ and change lives?" and have articulated three primary ministries:

Creating a Christian foundation for families Learning more about Jesus Living our faith beyond our walls

And so what do we (the church) need to live out and into these ministries? To answer that question, the Church Council has formed a **Facilities Steering Team** to begin a master planning process. Those who have been in our church for decades know as well as anyone that there are important issues we need to address in order to fulfill our purpose and mission. A primary issue is accessibility...while the sanctuary screams INaccessible, there is really NO area in our church (or Parish House) that is accessible (stairs everywhere; narrow doorways; small, hard to reach bathrooms...)

And there are plenty of other hurdles in our buildings and grounds to *Sharing Christ — Changing Lives* when you take the time to look around. That we own two buildings bisected by a road is problematic as well. Ever since I arrived here 9+ years ago, there has been a slow drip of people who ask me, "When are we going to sell the Parish House and build out back?" The quick answer is "I don't know."

What I do know is that it's time to begin exploring possibilities for how we can more effectively and efficiently *Share Christ and Change Lives* by creating a Christian foundation for families, learning more about Jesus, and living our faith beyond our walls. And so in the next weeks your Facilities Steering Team will be meeting with realtors to assess the value of the Parish House, meeting with potential architects who could help us develop a master plan, hosting a conversation after church on January 24 to hear your thoughts on all this. (You can follow the progress of these conversations through a link in the weekly email.)

The Christian faith is about becoming new — new every day, every year, every decade.... because in Christ we are given a new identity, we are set apart for HIS purposes. And the church is not the church if we don't point to Christ, and endeavor to make the world a better place. I look forward to exploring what this means for OUR life together in the year to come!

Church Council Meeting Summary December 16

Harvest Fair 2016: We discussed where the profits from the 2016 Harvest Fair might be directed (in whole or in part depending on the needs of the 2016 operating budget). If you have thoughts to share about this, please contact Rev. Gail or Stefanie Lempp.

B&G has bought a new stove and hood fan; they will be installed in the new year.

At the Annual Meeting, the Church Council will recommend that the Flower Ministry be removed from the Committee/Ministry Roster. For two years, the duties of the Flower Ministry have been taken on by the Deacons, Carol in the office, Tom our Sexton, and other volunteers in the church.

The Steering Task Force has been formed (Tim Dumont, Pete Hnath, Stefanie Lempp, Julie Platt and Gail Miller) to begin working to produce a Master Plan for a potential building project. On January 24, there will be an open brainstorming session to hear the thoughts and ideas from the congregation at large. Baby-sitting and a light lunch will be provided.

(As of Dec. 16) We have received 93 Pledges for 2016, including 11 new and 39 that increased an average of 21%; however, it is expected that the total will fall \$46K short of our goal. Contact Bob Goudey with your questions.

Dream Big Conversation Sunday, January 24, After Worship




Teachers Needed
