This week, I went to the big white board in our kitchen where we keep a weekly schedule of Sophia's schedule on one half, and our family to-do list on the other half. The family side contains items like the BJ's shopping list, reminders to pick up meds at CVS or mow the lawn; as well as longer range things like "finish rebuilding the porch" and "clean up the basement." We've been known to have items linger there for years even! And then there are times when we are inspired (motivated?) to get to it and we are erasing items regularly.

All three of us in our family are list-makers, and so the kitchen white board is an important feature in our house and our daily lives!

Well, this week, I decided to "wipe the slate clean"! A couple of items had been there since spring of 2014, so I declared them to have "expired," and the rest of it was for the most part specific to the summer, so I got out the Clorox wipe (a dry erase eraser won't do it for this kind of cleaning...) and with great satisfaction.... back and forth, up and down... and voila! Then I declared to Mike, "Look! We have a blank slate!"



How true this is — in more ways than one! Every day, we have a blank slate with God. He doesn't remember the snippy way we spoke to our kids yesterday, or the secret desire we hold for our coworker to not do so well so we can rise in the eyes of the boss, or the little piece of information we passed along that we "heard" from someone else, or the resentment we hold onto from years ago that has grown into a wedge, or.....

God doesn't wait until we get our act together or our white boards empty to declare his unconditional love for us in Christ. No! It is yours to claim and receive no matter how messy your kitchen white board. You do not earn this kind of love, but you do have to receive it. So take a few minutes to stop, look at where you are and where you need to go, and recommit to walking in the love of Christ each step of the way. And if you need a visual reminder of this powerful truth, go ahead and clean off the white board too.





Your FaST team has slowed to a more manageable pace over the summer, as we continue to refine the size and scope of the proposed building addition. We have also stretched the timeline

out such that we will not be ready for formal Congregational approval in October (as initially suggested). We do plan to begin sharing the details of the project in one-on-one conversations and small groups over the next weeks. 
Ooooh! I don't want summer to be over! I do hope all the Cherubs and their families had a wonderful one!
