God was with us in 2016 and will be with us in 2017. This is promised!

When Jesus was born, God revealed the birth of his son in the form of a star to "wise men" or magi from the East. After two years of following the star, they were led to Jerusalem to inquire of the king (a very bad and mean King Herod) where they might find another King, born more recently. Well, Insecure King Herod needed to rid the world of this new rival to his authority, and so ordered all male children under age two to be killed. This sent the Holy Family fleeing — they became refugees. I wonder how their faith fared during these trying times...if they wondered if God was REALLY with them.

An author I like (David Lose) writes about this story (found in the Gospel of Matthew), and the promise of God-with-us:

When you think about it, Emmanuel — God-with-us — wouldn't really mean all that much if it was only God with us during the tender moments, during times of celebration, during the Christmas Eve services of our lives. Yes, those moments of joy are gifts from God and it's right to give God thanks for them. But if we're glad that God is with us in times of rejoicing, we're desperate to know that God is also with us in times of grief, loss, and fear. Yes, this reading is tough to hear a week after Christmas, but for this reason it is also important.


And Matthew goes even further. For God is not only with us, God is also for us, promising to bring us through difficult times to the other side, if not unscathed, nevertheless still victorious. Matthew structures this passage around prophecies, demonstrating that even the darkest portions of Jesus' story turn within a larger narrative of God's providence and protection. This is not to say that all these events are simply part of some larger, if rather dark, "plan," but rather to remind us that nothing that happens to Jesus — or, by extension, to us — is beyond the bounds of God's love and activity and cannot be redeemed and even used by God.

God is with us, even in the darkest times. And God is also for us, promising not only to accompany us through difficult times but also to bring us to the other side that, in time, we might know the fullness of joy that is life in Christ. Not a bad message to hear on this first day of the New Year.

Bless you as we turn the page to a New Year, confident that while some things change with the passage of time, one thing NEVER CHANGES - God is with us!



Pledges for 2017 are coming in below our goal; there will be a 'Faith' line item of \$6,800 to balance the 2017 budget.

This winter, the Stewardship committee will be sponsoring a new way to give — a Winter Carnival for the women's bathroom. There will be opportunities to help renovate and to buy needed materials for the bathroom; as well as food for the work crews (details on p. 5).

Sunday Worship in the Event of a Storm

New Approach to Fellowship Hour

Everyone Takes a Turn

One of the most joyous times in our life together as a church happens after worship every Sunday. The Fellowship Hall is abuzz with conversation and greetings, folks sit at tables catching up on the week, children play and spin on the carpet and the pillar-poles and under the tables.

Creating the environment for this lovely and lively fellowship is an important part of who we are. Visitors and new folk see and experience the warmth of our life together, and we have an opportunity to meet and greet them.

While the church provides (pays for) the coffee / tea / supplies, we (the people!) need to provide the people to make it happen each week. The Kitchen Ministry (anywhere from 4 - 6 people) cannot be expected to be the kitchen workers for the 52 Sundays of the year.

And so, starting in February, we will take turns serving as the kitchen "staff" each week.

How will this work? There are 48 Sundays from Feb. 5 - Dec. 31, and so two capable households will be assigned to each Sunday (three households for Confirmation, Easter, Sept. 10, and Dec. 24). This will work out to each capable household serving once or perhaps twice in 2017.

You mean I have no say in when I serve? No...Should you prefer to choose your date now to avoid times you know you'll be away/unavailable, please email Carol (unioncc@uccgroton.org) in the church office by January 15.

What if I can't serve on the date I've been given? Once the schedule has been made, you will receive the full schedule for the year. Should you need to change your date, you will need to swap with someone or find a replacement; then let Carol know who that will be.

How on earth will I remember when my turn is when it is weeks/months away? As your assigned date approaches, Carol will send you a reminder.

What if something happens last minute and we just can't make it? Having two households per week will ensure that, if last minute emergencies crop up, there is still someone to show up that morning.

What exactly are we responsible for? Set up - serving - clean up. This will mean arriving a little early and staying a little late. Details / instructions will be sent to you once the schedule is made.

What if I've never been in the kitchen and have NO CLUE how to do this? Once the schedule has been made, you will receive instructions for how to set up / serve / clean up Fellowship Hour. If you are new to the kitchen, we invite you to plan to stop in sometime in the weeks ahead of your Sunday and ask whomever is in there to show you the ropes. We will have good instructions by the coffee maker and on the refrigerator so you will know exactly what to do.

Will there be enough coffee/cream/sugar/supplies? The Kitchen Ministry is responsible for monitoring and resupplying the kitchen. Carol manages the coffee orders.

What about the food on the table - where does that come from? The food offered each week is a combination of items that the church pays for, homemade goodies, and "leftovers" from the prior week or events. Details about this will be in your instructions.

Tell me again why we're doing it this way?

Because Fellowship Hour is extremely important to the life of our church.

Because sharing in the work of the church by taking a turn is a way we live our faith.

Because serving each other is what Christ wants us to do.

Because it feels good to do our part.

Because a ministry that serves so many should be shared by many.

Because bringing joy to others is what Christians do.

Bathroom Renovation Project

(aka Winter Carnival in/for the Women's Bathroom)

When new people come to a church, their first impressions are formed by a number of things, including the condition of the bathrooms (believe it or not!). And as many of you have noted, the women's bathroom in the Church building could use some updating. And so from February 2 - 11 we will take on a ten-day work project (aka "Carnival") to overhaul this space. The project will include painting the walls, retiling the floor, installing new fixtures, lighting and stall doors, adding hooks and a fold down changing table (and fixing the door that doesn't stay closed!).

And since we know many of you are handy with home projects, we've decided to keep this in-house and do the work ourselves. Also, since our decision to proceed with this was made after we determined the 2017 operating budget, we need to invite you to make a special gift by purchasing materials for the project.

Here's how you can get involved:

- Financially: Visit our registry (link will be provided in the Friday email beginning Jan. 6, or at the Project Table at Fellowship Hour beginning Jan. 8). You can purchase anything from a toilet paper holder to all the new stall partition/doors.
- Skills/Time: We have broken the project into 15 tasks and will need nearly 50 volunteers in varying capacities — from demolition, to making a trip to the dumpster, to painting, to more skilled work of installing toilets/light fixtures. We will also need **people to provide meals** for the workers who will be spending their time at the church over the ten-day period.

Beginning Sunday, January 8, we will have a Volunteer Board at the Project Table in the Fellowship Hall. There you can see the full list of the different tasks, exactly what days you'll be needed for these tasks, and can sign up accordingly. (After January 8, the information will also be available online through Sign-up Genius.)

What a great way to support your church and start the new year out by participating in a project that is much needed and will have a lasting impact on our church for decades to come!
