FROM THE

Getting Away and Coming Home



Many of us have the privilege of "getting away from it all" from time-to-time. We typically do this in the summer, when kids and grandkids are not in school. I enjoy seeing photos of your travels and weekends away on Facebook and hearing of your reconnecting with family and friends at Fellowship Hour after church.

I too have been fortunate to visit some beautiful places, not just this summer, but over a lifetime of travel to places that are truly stunning — some remote and some as close as the next town over. And I think I'm not alone in feeling or renewing a conviction that God is real and in this place, when looking up at the deep blue of the sky, or across a vast plain to a far off horizon, or down in the tangle and colors of a blossoming garden.

And what is wonderful about these moments and places is not only what is there, but what is NOT there—the demands of living in community with others. The trees don't disagree with each other. The babbling brook and lapping waves offer comfort and peace. There is no need to raise money for a better building, because look around...what could be better than this? It is no surprise that many testify that their surest encounters with God are in the natural world.

Nevertheless, the affirmation that God can be found outside the church has never seemed like much of a claim. The true wonder is that God can be found inside the church, among quirky, flawed and broken people who may have little in common and yet are bound to one another. What an unlikely setting in which to encounter God. But the Christian God seems to like to surprise us by showing up in the most unpromising places, like a Jew from Nazareth and in a motley gathering of people known as church.

God throws us together in the church and says, in essence, "Here is where you get a chance to learn how to live with other people, to forgive, and even come to see God in one another. After all, if you can find God here, you can find God anywhere."

The church, like the family, is the place where we learn to live with people we are stuck with. And when we stick with those we are stuck with, it is a living reminder of the God who is stuck with us all. (Martin Copenhaver, UCC Daily Devotional, 8-18-17)

I love this about the church — and OUR church. Many of my pastor friends / colleagues serve churches filled with people of one political stripe. Not us! We are all over the map; and yet we gather around one table to worship one Lord. We bring our whole selves to worship, including our particular and differing views, and the Holy Spirit makes us ONE body.

To my mind this is the church at its best — a people with diverse and (even) conflicting views on you-name-the-topic, gathering regularly not to have our own positions affirmed, but to discover God's will for us as individuals and as a body, to listen (really listen) to each other, and to be changed in the process. Christians believe that we are to be "conformed to the image of Christ," (Romans 8:29) and this can only be done TOGETHER!

So take this moment to recommit yourself to your church: to coming on Sundays as much as you can, to making and deepening friendships with people here, to participating in a study group or service opportunity. Experience the power of God's love like no where else!

I look forward to the months ahead as we discern what God wants for and from us.

UCC Faith Ringers Rehearsals begin Monday, September 11 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary We are excited to get back to


