These December days are filled with expectation and preparations as we revisit what it means for God to come to earth as a human being — Jesus Christ. And so that we don't miss a moment, the Bible readings of the season invite us to Lift up, Look up, Wake up, Get up. Our hearts, our minds, and our spirits are raised as we receive the good news that God has come close — so close that we can hear him breathe and see the dirt under his nails.

I love to read of the people who were right there when it happened, starting with Mary, who believed that it was indeed God's will for her to be the mother of the savior of the world. And then there's Elizabeth, her cousin, who knew in an instant that God was at work in both of their pregnancies. And how about Joseph? Who also had to not just **hear** God's voice, but **heed** it as well. And those shepherds, whose night out under the stars was far

from silent, when the angel chorus erupted. And the magi, who followed for months (years?) in faith and for miles the sign that God had given them.

When we read (and reread) about the people who were the first to know and be on the scene, it sounds so easy — this following of Jesus and knowing God's will. And I find myself saying (with frequency), "It's harder for us who live at a time when Jesus isn't walking around in the flesh." Or is it? Because, while the Bible gives us the accounts of those who saw, and knew, and responded, and followed; it also gives us those who missed the signs, who ignored the voice, who were face-to-face with Jesus and couldn't get out of their own way enough to see who was right in front of them.

All this is to say that if we're going to follow Christ, discern God's will for us, respond to the Holy Spirit's leading, we need to lift our eyes, our minds, our hearts and focus on Him. The church has been given a high calling — to proclaim the good news of God's love in Christ for and to ALL people. This is what we're here for; and our personal preferences take a back seat to this.

This is the context / motivation / foundation for the proposed building project. We're not pursuing it because WE think it's a good idea; but because we have discerned that it is in the service of God's calling on our congregation.... that Christ would be shared and lives would be changed. Because the question is, are we doing this (*Sharing Christ ~ Changing Lives*) to our fullest potential? I don't think so...Not when we ask kids to cross a street to get to Sunday School. Not when people, who've been worshiping here for years, don't know where the Pastor's office is. Not when people stay away from worship because it's just too hard to get in the building.

What Christ wants for his church — our church — is to be welcoming, hospitable, accessible, joyful, faithful... to point to Him in all our endeavors.

For years we've been making plans for the future of our church. (And, before that, there were decades of talking about making plans for the future of our church!) When we gather on Sunday, for the Informational Meeting about the proposed Building Project, we will learn more about what is possible and what it will take to bring to fruition our vision and goals of making the church building accessible and consolidating our ministries to one property.

It all starts with showing up, listening up.... but mostly lifting up our hearts to the Lord!

Church Council November 15 Meeting Summary

There was a discussion on how to spend the \$2,290 in the Birthday Fund; we are researching Easter banners for the Sanctuary, some new cookware (such as pots and pans) and new folding chairs for the Fellowship Hall.

Congregational Budget Meeting Summary Sunday, November 19



The preliminary 2018 budget was passed; the final 2018 budget will be voted on at the Annual Meeting on January 28, 2018.

The Birthday Fund has \$2,290. It will be spent on banners for the Sanctuary, \$750 for upgrades to the kitchen cookware, and the remainder will be spent on nicer folding chairs for the Fellowship Hall.

Teen Challenge Banquet

Teen Challenge held its' annual banquet on October 27 at the Radisson Hotel in Manchester, NH, and ten from our church were seated at a front row table. The theme of this year's banquet was *Expanding Borders* and, based on the scripture from 1Chronicles 4:10, when Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request.

One of the speakers, Governor Chris Sununu, spoke about how he had presented this program to the National Drug Czar just the day before and stood before the President of the United States asking for assistance with creating more faith-based programs of this kind. The Mayor of Manchester, Ted Gastsas, spoke about the "Safe Stations," which are safe places for individuals with addictions to turn to when they need help without fear of punishment.

Teen Challenge is hopeful to increase their 26 bed residential program to 100 beds and also create a 30bed detox medical unit as well, in order to serve a greater need in their community. It is so exciting to see the incredible things God is doing and the lives that are forever changed because of the great work of *Teen Challenge*.



Tewksbury Hospital Giving Tree



Groton Community Christmas Concert


Sunday, December 10 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. Monday, December 11 7:30 p.m.
