




The fact that I am a woman does not make me a different kind of Christian, but the fact that I am a Christian does make me a different kind of woman. ~Elisabeth Elliot

Annual Meeting Summary (January 28)

The new roster of Officers, Committee, and Ministry members was approved. (This is available on the inside cover of the yellow Directories on the back tables at church.)

Treasurer's Report: Dennis Carey presented the proposed changes to the 2018 Operating Budget. Pledges were well below our goal of \$295K, resulting in \$35K in cuts from the previously approved budget (Nov. 2017). Then we received an additional \$21,000 toward the 2018 Operating budget (\$20K as a single one-time gift). Conversa-

tion continued around our Church's priorities and what might be restored. A variety of opinions were expressed: The Harvest Fair as mission money, or operating, or a combination of both; restore salary increases, care for our buildings and grounds, accrue sabbatical funds. It was also suggested that we examine why there was such a decrease in pledging, and how we are reaching and engaging new people. The budget discussion was closed without a vote. The Finance Committee and Church Council will continue to monitor and adjust the budget.

Facilities Steering Team (FaST) Update: Craig Smith summarized the decision to "pause" the Building Project due to the concern about taking on a mortgage given the budget short fall this year. Questions were raised about modifying the plans, taking a phased approach. Several people expressed the wish that the "pause" not be very long. The Council will continue these conversations.

Church Council Meeting Summary February 28

This was the first meeting of the 2018 Church Council, so we spent time with introductions and sharing.

Dennis Carey and the Finance Committee presented a final 2018 budget with a profit of \$945. In light of the recent gifts / increases received, they have lowered the Fundraising Income to \$1,000 (freeing up the Harvest Fair profit to go in mission), and restored salary increases as well as a number of committee budgets. The budget was approved by the Council and will be available in the office and at church in the near future.

We discussed the first chapter of *Lasting Impact* by Carey Nieuwhof. A subset of the Council will also work through another book, *Multiply Your Impact* with Gail. Both of these books will help us define our priorities and purpose as a church.
