#### **Church News**

#### **Stated Meeting (June 3) Summary**

Mary Hanson filled in as Moderator in Stefanie Lempp's absence.

Annual Meeting Minutes (January 28): Unanimously accepted as printed.

**Backpack Drive:** Andrea McDonough presented a proposal to adopt the Backpack Drive (formerly organized by *Loaves & Fishes*) as an ongoing ministry of our church. This would become our own ministry and we will put a Christian emphasis on it. After questions and conversation, we unanimously approved adopting this program.

#### Conversation: What's next for our church?

- **People & Participation:** Steve Legge presented. A group from the Council (Bebe Goudey, Steve Legge, Mary Hanson) joined by Anne Larsen, Janet Kennedy, and Margaret Wheeler, has met nine times over the last two months discussing our church, its culture, and how we reach out to folks who are new or have stopped attending. They have been reading the book *Multiply Your Impact* (by Paul Nixon and Christie Latona). This group will make recommendations to the Council later this summer, but in the meantime another group will meet to consider how to improve our hospitality to first-time visitors and people who are new to the church.
- Building Project: Mary began by asking for our thoughts on what our priorities should be relative to the building. Clearly accessibility to the sanctuary is a priority. Several members also spoke about the inability of outside groups to utilize our space for their events due to lack of accessibility. Others mentioned improving parking and ongoing maintenance of the Church Building and the Parish House. Configurations of ramps and elevators were suggested. The Church Council will take all of this into account when determining how to proceed with next steps.
