

As long as I've been pastor here (12+ years now!) and for decades before I arrived, this church has struggled with the INaccessibility of our buildings. Not just the second floor sanctuary, but even the "First" floor (Fellowship Hall, bathrooms, etc.) still requires six steps up and two steps down to get to it.

Between 2013 and 2017 the Facilities Steering Team worked to develop a building plan, which would not only make our Church building accessible, but our offices and Sunday School as well. This plan included a building addition extending out back of the Church building, and was large in scope and in cost. We determined that this plan is not the right thing for us at this time, and so we "paused" the project to reconsider our priorities.

Since then, both at public meetings and in private conversations, many of you have shared that we should not abandon the goal of making our Church building fully accessible. And so the Church Council has been discussing a Building Project 2.0. We would like to share those conversations beyond the Church Council, and so you are invited....

We'll look at the process and next steps for addressing the accessibility issues for the Church Building.

It feels good to be "hitting the play button" on this very important issue in our church. It is heart-breaking to hear of people who don't worship or attend gatherings in the Fellowship Hall because they cannot get into the room. And it happens more than you might think.

If we're going to be faithful to our purpose of *Sharing Christ* and *Changing Lives*, we need to make it easy for people to get in and around in our building.

Plan to be there on October 14, as we take a step in the right direction.




