Gary Gamuchian and a new opportunity for us!

Gary is a member of the Congregational Church of Littleton and is completing his final requirement on the way to becoming a Pastor in the United Church of Christ. He will be doing an internship (unpaid) with us beginning at the end of November through June. Since he has already done an internship at his church in Littleton and as a University Chaplain (UMass Lowell), his time with us will provide him an opportunity to minister in a church that doesn't already know him.

His primary areas of ministry with us will be: Worship, Visitation, Preaching, Administration, and a couple of New Initiatives that we will discern together. Since he has served as the Christian Education Director at his Littleton church (2012-2018), he will not be serving in our "education" department. He will lead worship every week, preach occasionally, visit folks in their homes and in hospitals / facilities, learn about how our church functions, and develop a new initiative or two with us. He will attend different committees and ministries of the church, as well as worship planning meetings with the music staff and me. As his supervisor, we will meet weekly; and he will also meet with an Intern Advisory Team of three lay people monthly.

All this is approved and supervised by the Committee on Ministry for our Central Association of the Massachusetts Conference United Church of Christ (wow that was a mouthful!), and we will make midyear and final reports to them in March and June.

Gary graduated from Andover Newton Theological Seminary in 2017, and before that he had a career in customer relations and as an engineer. Gary is widowed and has two children, Gordon, a junior at Littleton High School, and Calista, an eighth grader at Littleton Middle School. They are both very involved at their church in Littleton, so we won't be seeing them on Sundays, just Gary.

Gary will be with us on November 18th to "meet and greet" us; and then he'll begin officially on December 2nd, the First Sunday of Advent.

I believe the Holy Spirit is at work in bringing Gary to us and us to Gary at this time. And I look forward to serving with him and discovering what we can learn from him as well as what he can learn from us.

Church Council Meeting

October 24

Confirmation class for the 2018-19 year begins this week and Gail has a large group of 16 kids. This is always an exciting time for Gail and for the many people in our church who are involved with our youth, whether it be as mentors, teachers, or parents.

A pastoral student has asked to take on an Intern role in our church this year. Gail presented his responsibilities and learning goals and the Church Council has approved the plan. He will begin working with us more closely in December with Gail as his supervisor.

A budget update was provided in advance of the November 18 Congregational Budget Meeting. At that time the budget for 2019 will be approved. We also discussed how we might use the Birthday Fund and the Endowment Fund monies, which the Council decides to spend. Suggestions for expenditures were made, and the Council will make a decision regarding these at our meeting in November.

We continued our discussion of the book *Lasting Impact*, specifically with regard to the idea that churches need to be flexible and adaptable in order to thrive and grow. We also need to provide opportunities for engagement beyond attending worship. The "Multiply Your Impact" subcommittee reported on some excellent ways in which this can happen.
