Here is a good word from an author I like - the word is SURPRISE - and here's what he says:



As servants of God, we must learn to make room for Him— to give God "elbow room." We plan and figure and predict that this or that will happen, but we forget to make room for God to come in as He chooses. Would we be surprised if God came into our meeting or into our preaching in a way we had never expected Him to come? Do not look for God to come in a particular way, but do look for Him. The way to make room for Him is to expect Him to come, but not in a certain way. No matter how well we may know God, the great lesson to learn is that He may break in at any minute. We tend to overlook this element of surprise, yet God never works in any other way. Suddenly—God meets our life "...when it pleased God...." (Galatians 1:15)

Keep your life so constantly in touch with God that His surprising power can break through at any point. Live in a constant state of expectancy, and leave room for God to come in as He decides. (Oswald Chambers, My Utmost for His Highest)

Surprise!

That might not be the first word I'd think of if I were asked how God works in the world, or in my life. But when I think about it, I'd have to say that it's a pretty good descriptor. God's been surprising His people since the beginning...providing food for them when they were hungry and wandering in the wilderness, choosing David to be King (when he was the last person on the "short list").

The events around Jesus' birth are full of surprises — angel visits, Mary being chosen, visitors from the East, warnings in dreams to flee for safety.

Until March 6th the church is in the season of Epiphany, which means to "shine upon." It's when we lift up the ways that Jesus shines in the world and in our lives. And, if Oswald Chambers is right, that God's surprising power can break through at any point (and I believe he is right!), then we should be on the lookout for him.

When you are surprised by something, even something bad or troubling, ask "God, what are you showing me here? What do you want me to know or learn? What do you want me to do?" He'll respond — somehow — He'll show you.



Five Sundays in March (time tbd)


