Adventuring through Acts

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the farthest parts of the earth. Acts 1:8

Gail and I will be preaching on selections from the Acts of the Apostles for the month of March and into early April. The Acts of the Apostles was compiled by the same author as the Gospel of Luke. It is the record of the early church in its absolute infancy. In the same way the Gospel of Luke follows Jesus from Galilee into Jerusalem, Acts has a trajectory, which takes the Good News and the church, empowered by the Holy

Spirit, from Jerusalem out into the world. The roots of every church, every community gathered in Christ's name can be traced back to that group gathered in Jerusalem.

Acts is a tremendous volume of historical and spiritual information. It is the first history of the church. We could preach on Acts every Sunday for a year and still have material left over. But the selections we have chosen should convey the overarching themes found in Acts. Additionally, on March 31, I am going to need some help with the service (see p. 2).

Gail and I identified six passages that we think are the "greatest hits" of Acts:

March 3 Acts 2:1-12 (Pentecost)

March 10 Acts 2:43-47 (Early Community)


March 17 Acts 6 (Stephen / First Deacons)

March 24 Acts 9 (Paul and Ananias)


March 31 Acts 16 (Paul and Silas in Macedonia)

More than 50 people were present for this meeting, chaired by Moderator Stefanie Lempp, at which we:


- Reviewed and approved the minutes from the Congregational meeting on November 18.


