After Psalm 23, I think Psalm 121 may be the next well known of the 150 Psalms. It is also often read at funerals, and in my opinion is more appropriate for such times than is Psalm 23. It speaks of the steadfast presence of the Lord, especially during difficult times. The last line

ASTOR The Lord will keep your going out and your coming in from this time on and forevermore (v.8) .

"Going out" and "coming in" moments are fraught—fraught with drama, anxiety, and possibility. Another word for these times is transition. And spring, it sometimes seems, is one transition after another.

Graduations. It went by so quickly. A job change. Will I be up to it? A move. Everything is different here. Retirement. I can't wait. I'm terrified.

If it is true that God offers a special promise of presence during these in between times, then it is also the case that such changes may break us open to the Holy Spirit in unexpected ways. (Tony Robinson, UCC Daily Devotional for May 1, 2019)

As Christians, all of our life is lived "in between" In between our acknowledgement / acceptance / awareness of God's claim and call on our lives, and the future to which He is calling / sending us or the person / people He desires for us to be. There is no standing still for Christians! We are always on the move!

That doesn't mean our journeys and these transitions are not difficult at times — they are to be sure. And when seismic changes come, we can feel vulnerable. We ask, What and whom can I hold onto? and Who, or what, holds onto me?

Well, ours is a God who knows the journey, who is also on the move, who goes ahead of us to Galilee. You will be upheld. You will be sustained in your going out and coming in. And so we trust this.



Accessibility Project—Progress Update

On April 11, our Church Accessibility Project Team got a first look at preliminary Schematic Design plans. We were pleased to see that architect, Paul Adison, captured the essence of our ultimate goal, to make both floors of the church fully accessible to all. His design creates a welcoming space that also preserves the historic and neighborhood character of the church. In addition to an elevator, important features of the plans are ADA compliant men's and women's lavatories on both floors, a music office/rehearsal room, deacons' storage, and a new stairway. We'll be receiving and reviewing the cost estimate sometime in May. Stay tuned!

A Message from Bernard Crane

A Concert of the Music of Helen C. Crane Saturday, June 1 2:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary

Featuring: Amy Sims, violin; Velleda Miragias, cello; plus others.

Who is Helen Crane? I came across her quite by accident - just wondering if there were any other Cranes who were composers. There is an online database of all the world's composers whose music is now in the public domain, where I discovered Helen Crane and one piece of music published in German around 1907. I was amazed at the quality, creativity, and "chops" of this composer, an American schooled in a European Conservatory (before Irving Berlin, George

Gershwin, or J.P. Sousa).

I became eager to find more of her music and discovered an article on the Crane family's donation to the New York Public Library of all their significant documents, including Helen Crane's original manuscripts. So I traveled to New York to see these items and, if possible, to come away with some images of the originals. What I found was 18 boxes of music (about 75 serious pieces of music, songs, chamber music, pieces for quartet, orchestra and chorus, even two symphonies and the sketches of a third). Most of these were in their original handwritten format, seemingly not seen or touched since 1940. Since these pages could not go through a copy machine, I photographed them and returned home to begin the task of printing them in a reproducible format.

Since that first visit to New York, I have retrieved 1,400 pages of her work, and it is amazing!! Breathtaking music, which has not been heard for over 80 years (Ms. Crane died in 1930 at the age of 62). I am eager to share with you this musical bounty! There is no charge, but donations will be accepted to help defray the cost of musicians. If you would like to get a preview of what you will hear live, check out www.soundcloud.com/bernardcrane; click on any of the pieces with her image. Listen and be surprised as I was.
