And if you've not picked up my gift to you - a photo of the steeple with a quote from Augustine on it - they are available in the hallway downstairs at church on Sundays, or in the church office during the week.

It was these times in your lives during my early years here that we began to grow together in a deeper sharing in Christ. ### A Message from the Church Council

God has a lot of changes planned for our church! This last month we have spent time preparing for Pastor Gail's departure and celebrating our 13 years with her.

Now our focus is shifting to searching for an Interim Pastor. The UCC Conference is working closely with the Council and the Deacons to guide us through the process of finding an Interim Pastor.

The Deacons completed the church profile, which recently was posted on the National Ministerial Opportunities website.

What happens next:

- 1. Search Committee is formed.
- 2. Search Committee interviews candidates
- 3. Deacons will make the hiring decision.

We anticipate interviewing candidates over the summer and into September and making a decision in the fall timeframe.

### **Church Council (June 12) Summary**

The Council shared some sorrows and some joys in anticipation of Gail's imminent departure. We also thanked Gary for the time he spent with us during the church year, as his time here also comes to an end.

The Accessibility Steering Team provided an update with a timeline of a planned presentation to the Congregation on September 22, and the Council approved this date. In addition, the Council set the Stated Meeting for October 27, at which point the congregation will have the opportunity to vote to approve the project to date.

The Summer Worship schedule goes into effect beginning June 23 Worship time will remain at 10:00 a.m., and we have preachers and musicians in place for the entire summer.

There was a proposal to suspend our participation in *Grotonfest* this year for several reasons, among them the transition, the difficulty of staffing the booth, and the focus on the Harvest Fair the following weekend. We agreed that we will not have a booth at Grotonfest this year.

An update on the pastor transition was shared; our church profile is nearly complete and shortly we will begin receiving candidates for an Interim Pastor.

It's the first Sunday morning after the Accessibility Project addition is completed and ready for all of you to enter for the <u>first</u> time. ### **Backpack Drive**



# Sharing Christ ~ Changing Lives ~ Providing Backpacks!

We are ready to launch our second UCC Groton Backpack Drive and will be providing 250-300 students with backpacks and school supplies on August 23, 2019. Cheerful volunteers (YOU) are the key to making this program a success. Here's how you can help:

- Volunteer to set-up at Devens Community Center, August 21-22. We need people to be "on call" to unload a truck and to help stock tables on set-up day with donated school supplies and backpacks at several times on August 21 and 22. Morning, afternoon, and evening volunteers are welcome. All church youth are welcome and encouraged!
- Volunteer on Distribution Day, Friday, August 23. Be involved as a greeter who checks people in or as a "personal shopper" with families for backpacks and supplies during two separate shifts (8:30 a.m. 11:30 a.m. and 5:00-7:00 p.m.) at Devens Community Center. Due to privacy concerns, volunteers must be adults.
- Volunteer over the following weekend or Monday/Tuesday the following week to help with clean-up, organization of remaining supplies, and distribution of supplies to area schools.
- *Make a monetary donation*, which will be used to buy school supplies and backpacks. Look for the link in the Friday email to give online; or you can write out a check to UCC Groton (Backpack Drive in the memo section) and mail it to Carol Zaiatz in the Church Office (220 Main Street).
- **Shop for backpacks:** A large number of backpacks are being donated by others, but we are responsible for providing approximately 50 varied backpacks for middle school, high school, and college students. Backpacks must be provided by August 1.
- **Volunteer to shop in early August** for any shortfall of school supplies that may still be needed. If you enjoy finding bargains and bulk-shopping (either online or in person), we may need a few people to help with last-minute shopping of outstanding items (to be determined). If they are items we have assigned, you can be reimbursed for the cost of purchased items.
- **Donate school supplies:** The following items are needed to round out the many donations provided by others. Please only provide items with the specifications listed here and feel free to buy in bulk to get the best deals:
  - -150 3-ring binders with 2-inch rings
  - -500 pocket folders
  - -90 packs of index cards (no more than 100 cards per pack)
  - -150 packs college-ruled 3-ring binder paper (pre-holed or "filler paper")
  - -150 college-ruled composition books
  - -120 packs of dividers for 3-ring binders
  - -120 mechanical pencils

Please consider giving a few hours of your time so that area children can share in the excitement of a new school year without the worry of being unprepared. **Donations of backpacks and supplies will be collected in Fellowship Hall near the Choir room starting July 18.**

Whenever I have a stressful, terrible, or just an ok day, I like to pray to God. It helps me to share problems, worries, and things that I am grateful for... ### **Youth Mission Trip**

# Youth Mission Trip to Clendenin, West Virginia June 22—June 30

Our youth (and advisors) served on several building projects in the Clendenin area. What a wonderful way to *Share Christ and Change Lives* beyond the borders of our town.




