A Message from the Diaconate

Our Interim Period

This is an exciting time for our church. The UCC Massachusetts Conference website summarizes the interim period as follows:

Interim time is a crucial time in the life of a congregation. It's an important time to reflect on where the church has been and where it is going. To prepare for the next chapter in the life and ministry of the church, this is a pivotal time to discover "Who we are?", "Who is our neighbor?", and "What is God calling us to do and to be?" Finding this crystal clarity is pivotal to an effective search process for the next pastor, as well as a healthy, faithful, and effective start in the church's next chapter.

We have been blessed to have Reverend Gail leading us along our spiritual path for the last 13 years. As she begins a new chapter in Concord, we begin a new chapter in Groton. Even without a pastor in the past few months, we are learning that WE – the congregation – are the church. We are energized and moving forward even as we wait. Adult leaders and youth are busy planning the Mission Trip to Guatemala for next year. The Accessibility Steering Team received unanimous approval to "move forward" with the Capital Campaign for the proposed Building Project. Our church is not sitting around waiting for our next leader, our next Interim or our next Settled Pastor. We are moving forward – Sharing Christ and Changing Lives.

Reverend Corey Sanderson will join us on December 1 and guide our church through our Interim Pastor period. He will steer us through the beginning of this chapter. This is not a period of just "keeping the ship afloat" and waiting for our next Settled Pastor. It is a dynamic time, a time to ask questions, and a time to take a close look in the mirror.

We will answer the questions posed by the UCC Conference by reflecting on where we have come from and discerning where we want to go. Looking back, we can acknowledge what we have accomplished, what we might have left undone, what our strengths are, and what challenges we are facing. Reverend Sanderson is trained specifically to help us in this way and brings the skills, energy, and passion necessary to support us in answering these questions. We will better learn who we are as a church and in which direction God is calling us to go. It is only then that we will be truly ready for the Holy Spirit to bring us a Settled Pastor.

Church News



September 25

The Council heard an update from the Interim Pastor Search Committee. The committee was very excited to report that they had extended an offer to an excellent candidate and expected to announce the name and other details to the parish on 9/29. It is

expected that the Interim will be in place to begin leading worship on 12/1. After the Interim Pastor arrives, the church will begin the work of forming a Settled Pastor Search Committee. Anyone can nominate anyone (including themselves) to serve on the committee, which should consist of 5-9 members.

The Finance Committee presented a budget update; at present we are on target financially for the year and anticipate being able to allocate some surplus funds to other areas in need.

Bebe Goudey summarized the presentation the Accessibility Steering Team gave to the congregation on 9/22. The team is extremely pleased with the plans presented by architect Paul Adison, and he answered many questions from the parish at that time. The team plans to compile all the questions and answers and make them available to any parishioners who were unable to attend the presentation. The next step will be to have a further discussion of the project at the Stated meeting on October 27 and potentially a vote to approve moving forward to the Capital Campaign.

October 30

The Finance Committee provided an update on the current 2019 Budget and the proposed 2020 Budget in advance of the November 17 Budget Meeting. Due to the changes in ministerial expenses. Despite a pledge shortfall, we are projecting a surplus this year. Some of this surplus has been allocated to B&G for painting and some to pay off a loan, which will then come off next year's budget. The balance of the surplus is being proposed for Missions, as our current overall percentage of income to Missions is only 3%. The 2020 Proposed Budget will be printed and available in church on Sunday, November 3.

We are going to be instituting an Online Church Directory where families can manage their own content. We haven't updated our picture directory in many years! This will be an easier way to keep it updated without going through a professional photo company for pictures. It will also be a great tool for our incoming Interim Pastor to learn who we are!

It is that time — we need to make committee nominations for the 2020 year. There are some areas in particular — Christian Education and Buildings & Grounds — where we are sorely in need of help. Especially in this time of transition, we really need to rely on our congregation to fill these important roles. Please carefully consider ways in which you can contribute your time and talents to our committees and ministries.

The Accessibility Steering Team provided an update and a look at next steps after the unanimous vote at our Stated Meeting (October 27) to move forward with a Capital Campaign! In the same vein as above, the primary focus right now is encouraging people to join the Capital Campaign Committee in any of a number of roles. People are all supportive of the project, which is heartening! But now we need to get people to accept a role on this committee, which is expected to be a short-term commitment. Please prayerfully consider whether you could help!


