A Message from Your Interim Pastor

Dear Friends,

During the 8:00 p.m. worship service on Christmas Eve, I shared a favorite poem written by Howard Thurman, former Dean of the Chapel at Boston University. Thurman had a profound and lasting influence on Martin Luther King, Jr. As King's mentor, Thurman introduced the younger Martin to Gandhi's work of non-violent resistance. Thurman's poem is entitled, *The Work of Christmas*. It reads,



When the song of the angels is stilled, When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins: To find the lost, To heal the broken, To feed the hungry, To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among brothers, To make music in the heart.

I read this poem every year to remind myself that Christmas is not simply a day or even the twelve-day liturgical season in the life of the Church. Christmas is the work of our lives.

One of the most beautiful images that inspires me to carry on *The Work of Christmas* comes from Saint Teresa of Avila. Five hundred years ago, Teresa wrote:

Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body.

I've come to see, through the years, that faith is not merely what we believe, but perhaps even more it is how we live our lives. We are called to practice our faith and we do that by being Christ's hands and feet and eyes in the world.

What are the gifts of your faith that you can share with other people in this new year? Maybe it is extending a hand in forgiveness to one who has wronged you. Maybe you can stand in solidarity with those who are marginalized and even persecuted in our society. Maybe you can look upon the faces of all whom you encounter with kindness and compassion.

May the Christmas story of God coming to dwell with us remind you that God dwells inside *you*. You are a beloved Child of God and with you God is pleased. That is your truest nature. That is the greatest gift of life. To practice one's faith involves living out of this sacred awareness. So, in the days ahead practice being Christ's hands and feet and eyes in all that you do. I wish you all great joy at the start of this new year.



#### Sermon on the Mount Series Thursdays (January 16—February 6) 6:30—8:00 p.m. in the Parish House

Four-week concurrent Sermon Series and Bible Study on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. Join Rev. Sanderson and experience the longest teaching of Jesus in the entire New Testament. The Sermon on the Mount is where we find many of the most meaningful teachings of Jesus, such as The Beatitudes, The Lord's Prayer, and The Golden Rule. We hear about 'the lilies of the field,' and the admonition that 'where

your heart is there your treasure will be also.' Yet in this same sermon we find the command to 'turn the other cheek,' to 'love your enemies,' and to stop judging others and being hypocritical. We find hard words about adultery and divorce, and a warning against religious leaders who parade around in public. Saint Augustine once described this sermon of Jesus as the 'perfect standard of the Christian life' and the teachings found in this sermon are often referred to as the 'Ethics of the Kingdom.' We can't cover every facet during these four weeks, but we will explore major portions. Join us Sunday mornings (January 12, 19, 26, February 2) for our regular worship service and on the four Thursday evenings (January 16, 23, 30, February 6) at 6:30 p.m. in the Parish House.
