### A Message from Your Pastor

In the life of the Christian church, we often talk about spiritual practices, or what are sometimes called spiritual disciplines. These are the foundational practices that lead us to a deeper life of faith, to a greater awareness of God's presence, and to a fuller understanding of our purpose in life. The most essential of these spiritual practices are familiar to us all; prayer, worship, reading the Bible, serving, and giving. While these certainly are the most essential practices, they aren't the only ones.

During the season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday (2/26), we will look to some of the lesser-known spiritual practices. Why some might seem a little less 'churchy' than you'd expect, they can be just as powerful and just as effective in our faith development. Whenever we pause to take stock of how our faith journeys are unfolding, we have the opportunity to learn, experience, and grow in new and different ways.

In addition to the thematic sermons, each Sunday bulletin will include a related insert for your weekly personal devotions. These inserts will have prayers, questions of self-reflection, recommended scripture passages, and topical quotes that you can use throughout the week.

I encourage you to make this season of Lent a time to re-engage or engage your spiritual growth. As we make our way through these six weeks, we will surely find an even greater joy awaiting us on Easter Sunday. Below is an initial outline of the intended topics.



### **Church News**



### **January 29 Meeting Summary**

The Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, February 2. Regarding committee nominations, some people have agreed to stay on through the summer or for one more year.

**Pastor's Report:** CityReach weekend was a fabulous experience. On February 9 we will have a guest pastor as we serve as a "Neutral pulpit" – a neutral location so that a searching parish can hear a prospective pastor preach. Also on that day, Carl Prestia is bringing in some Boy Scouts who may be involved worship. Corey plans to be on vacation from Feb. 18-25, so Gary Gumuchian will fill in on the Sunday he is away (2/23).

The Deacons requested something on spiritual practices during Lent, so Corey plans to do a sermon series on this, as well as a book study.

Corey met with the PPRC (Pastor-Parish Relations Committee) – Andrea, Jeff Kubick, and Bill Gale. One of the things Corey noticed is that there needs to be a forum within the church for people to get questions answered. We thought it would be a good idea to have occasional small forums where people can ask questions. Corey feels his communication with the congregation has been limited, mostly to Sunday mornings. He would like to piggy-back with the Friday email, maybe send something out once a week to communicate with the whole parish.

Corey would like to simplify the way meetings are scheduled and asked if there is a way that all the committees could pick some days and times to anchor down. With new committees starting up in February, this is the perfect time to do that.

**Finance Update (Dennis Carey)**: In the budget for 2020, we assumed a pledge number of 261,000. We increased Missions from 3% to 5% of net income. Unfortunately, pledges came in much lower than anticipated – just 246,000; too low to keep the original budgeted amount. The following two changes were made to the budget: we reduced the pledge donations down to 255,000, and we had to put Missions back at 3% rather than raise it to 5%.

**Capital Campaign (Bebe Goudey):** Bebe stated there will be an announcement about an upcoming kickoff event. They are zeroing in on a logo and talking about having a series of small dinners at people's homes, etc. They are not just trying to raise funds to build a building; it's not "fundraising" so much as it is "faith-raising". We have raised over \$55k to date.

**Birthday Fund:** It was agreed at the last meeting that we would go with lighting for the sign. We investigated what it would cost to run an electric line out to the sign; thi is more expensive than anticipated (at least \$1,800). We are back to solar, which should actually be less expensive than originally thought. John Biocchi is going to investigate further. We would also like to add a hard-wired light on the front of the building, which we have done on our own in the past but we really need to hire an electrician. Dennis said the remaining 2019 balance in the birthday fund is just over \$1,000.

## **Christian Education**



Dear Friends,

There is a scam going around where someone impersonates a local church pastor and asks people in the church to buy Gift Cards for them. The church people are asked to mail the gift cards to a certain address or take a picture of the bar code on the back side of the gift card with their phone and text it to a number (which allows the scammer to then use the gift card online).

Scammers can find email lists, Facebook posts, newspaper articles, lists of people in church leadership, and all sorts of information to find who is part of the church. They can easily create a fake email that shows up looking like pastor@uccgroton.org, but it has nothing to do with me. Please know I will NEVER ask for money, gift cards, help in posting bail, etc.

The best way to respond is to do nothing; just delete it. If you respond, they know you are 'active' and you will likely get added to other scam lists. If there's no response they will assume it is an old email, a defunct cell phone, or even a land line.
