What's It Worth To You?

Every now and then, I like to watch *Antiques Road Show* on PBS. If you've never seen the show, the premise is quite simple. People who have inherited some family heirloom, or purchased a piece of art at a yard sale, or have held on to some beloved childhood toy, will drag their 'treasure' onto the live-taped show to have an appraiser assess its value on the open market.

What makes such a potentially boring show so engaging is watching people feel like they have just won the lottery. After carefully looking the item over, the appraiser says, 'You aren't going to believe this, but this Chinese vase dates back to Ming Dynasty. On the market today, considering its condition, you could expect it to sell for \$200,000 at auction.' At this point, the woman gasps before going into a full-blown cardiac arrest right there on the set.

While such surprises are the obvious highlight, I have to confess that I also get just as much enjoyment when things go the other way. Some would-be hopeful arrives on the set, dragging in a vintage styled chair. After careful inspection, the appraiser says, 'You have a really nice Swedish chair here. It dates to around 1998, and can be bought for about forty dollars at your local Ikea.' It's a stark reminder that the only so-called value the chair has is the value that it has for the owner. It has no real value to other people, but it is valuable to you to the extent that *you* value it and use it.

Many years ago, when Nathan was quite young, he was given a very old antique Lionel train set from a relative. The relative had purchased the set many decades earlier but, for whatever reason, had not used it and it ended up in their basement. By the time Nathan received it, the train set was almost 50 years old. While the track was unusable from rust and corrosion, the engine and freight were in near perfect condition. When we went to the local hobby store to purchase a replacement track, the man behind the counter said, 'People are afraid to play with trains that are as old as this one. All they see is what the train is worth. But when I see an old train like this, all I see is a child's toy that is meant for play.'

We've probably all met a few folks in life who seem to care more about their outward appearances and the validation of others than they do about their inner spiritual life and their core values as people. When they polish up their persona with religion, or some public display of personal piety, they can look so perfect that you might be inclined to envy them. But Jesus was not impressed with these kinds of folks. One time, in speaking of the Pharisees and Scribes, the religious leaders of the day, Jesus said, 'Do what they teach, but don't do what they do, for they do not practice what they teach' (Matt 23:1-12).

Part of what Jesus was saying was that the real value of our faith comes down to whatever it's worth to us personally, because no one else is appraising it. The more of ourselves we put into our faith, the greater value it will have for us, and the more fruit it will bear in the world as compassion and justice. Jesus is not impressed by our appearances, or by our outward religiosity, or by what others think of us. We can drag out our rusty and dusty faith and ask him how much he thinks it's worth but, in the end, Jesus wants to know how much it is worth to us. Is it something you pull out from time to time, like some old antique? Or, is it something you use every day, like an old chair that will hold your weight without breaking, day-in and day-out, or like an old Lionel train set that is intended to give people joy? The real value of your faith is what you put into it; your life, your time, your devotion, your resources, your loyalties and commitments, your words, and your deeds.

May we all hold fast to this truth now and in the days ahead.

Thanks so much for your amazing efforts in making the Backpack Drive a success! Being able to give backpacks and school supplies to area families is a blessing! We could not do it without all of your donations and the many hands you provided in filling backpacks and distributing them on August 21. Over the course of the afternoon, we served over 50 families with about 124 stuffed backpacks and kits. We expect that a few more families will be in touch this week to pick up backpacks they couldn't receive on distribution day. In addition, 35 filled backpacks and kits went to 15 families who are currently living at *Transitions* through *Our Father's House* in Devens. The remainder of our filled backpacks and several hundred kits will go to local schools in Leominster, Ayer, Shirley and Groton for distribution to students who need them. Another 150 kits and about 400 unfilled backpacks will go to military families in the area through *Clear Path for Veterans New England*.
