Hello Friends,

This past Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, was our official re-opening since the pandemic caused us to close our doors back in March of 2020. Like a majority of churches across the country, we made the choice to temporarily suspend in-person worship and to shift to an online format. At the time, 62 weeks ago, none of us would have ever imagined how quickly and dramatically our lives were about to change.

We never would have imagined losing friends and family members, co-workers and neighbors, to the terrible pandemic scourge of Covid-19. We never would have imagined the long-overdue national racial reckoning that became a movement following the death of George Floyd. And who among us would have imagined such a difficult and controversial presidential election, capped off by a deadly white-nationalist insurrection of the national's capital? I think we can all agree that it's been a very long year.

The good news is that, according to the latest science, we have endured the worst of the pandemic. That means we can begin pulling back together all the disparate parts of our lives. For our church family, this means that returning to in-person worship can now be a safe experience, provided we all work together during the next few months.

Your church leaders know that not everyone is ready to return to in-person worship. That's totally fine. There are some folks in our congregation who will say it's still too early to regather, while others will say it's been far too late. Wherever you happen to be on that spectrum, we hope you will rejoin us when YOU feel most comfortable doing so. And if you've been worshipping elsewhere during this pandemic pause, we hope you'll return to the UCC Groton family as we recommit ourselves to the mission and ministry and vision that God has set before us as a congregation.

While state, national, and denominational guidelines are all loosening, and finally coming into greater alignment, we are going to take things slowly and carefully as we move through this regathering process.

For now, please plan to wear a mask if you are attending worship. Our mask protocol will likely change in upcoming weeks, but for now — whatever your position happens to be on it — we simply ask that you practice genuine Christian hospitality, concern, and care for others by wearing a mask whenever you are inside. We will certainly get to the place where masks are <u>not</u> needed, but let's just take it one step at a time for the time being. So, as we start up our in-person worship gatherings, let's be patient and accepting of each other by wearing a mask whenever we are inside the church building.

Please know that not everyone is going to be comfortable shaking hands or giving hugs. For the time being, be ready to offer a fist bump, elbow bump, a wave, or sign of peace, like we have all learned to do. So just give folks some time and space to get used to the idea of real human contact. Social graces really do go a long way.

During worship, make sure to give people outside of your family a little space, just a couple of feet or so. Yes, I know fully vaccinated people don't need to be socially distant according to the most recent CDC guidelines, but we don't know who is fully vaccinated, who is partially vaccinated, and who isn't vaccinated at all. So, while you may sit wherever you like in the Sanctuary, do consider giving one another a little space so that no one feels uncomfortable or concerned during worship.

Maybe you've heard the old late-night adage, 'You don't have to go home, but you can't stay here.' Well, after worship, you won't have to go home, but we are going to ask you to go outside. We are simply trying to limit conversations inside the building. So, after the Postlude, please make your way out to the front lawn and then you can catch up with one another without your masks on, where it is more safe and more comfortable. And if you would like to come to church early and greet one another outside on the front lawn before going inside for worship, that is totally fine too.

During these initial weeks of re-gathering, we won't be doing an official coffee hour, but we are working on how we can best resurrect this important social sacrament. Stay tuned.

During the next several weeks I invite you to practice some Grace — Grace with your church leaders, and Grace with those who are volunteering and helping out on Sunday mornings. If it's helpful, you might even want to think of it like this:

Give people around you some Space.

Let others engage at their own Pace.

And be ready to practice a little Grace.

CHURCH COUNCIL Summary for May 26 Meeting

A few people have joined the B&G Committee; Janice Owen has joined the Deacons, but they still need additional members. The CE Committee also has openings.

Dennis discussed the YTD statement (both summary and detail). The "miscellaneous income" includes the new PPE loan, as well as \$6,000 remaining from the first one. We might be able to use the unallocated amount for steeple repair. All the other expenses are as expected so things are looking good.

The Stated Meeting, which we typically have in June, is being pushed back to September 12.

May 23 was the first day of in-person worship since before Christmas. There were 35 people there. Corey said there was good energy and people seemed happy to be back. Pews are not roped off, although we are still doing sign-ups. After May 30, we may do away with signups, as capacity limits are lifted. We also will be bringing back a simplified printed worship bulletin. The jury is still out on singing, but Corey is attending a webinar next week and it would be good to wait until after that to see if we get any more clarity. Our Nursery Attendant is fully vaccinated and the Nursery is available for those who need it. We will probably have to move the kids into the parlor, since we have downstairs worship to consider as well.

Bob Hargraves suggested potentially converting one of the handicapped parking spaces right in front of the walkway into a "loading zone". He brings Ellen, gets her inside, and then moves his car, but noted that it's hard to pull in there as often someone has already parked in those spots.


